The earliest surviving adaptation of Stoker's novel, F. W. Murnau's film was an unauthorised version of the book in which the character names were changed in a failed attempt to conceal its origins. In Orlok, Murnau created a spectral and highly cinematic image of the vampire that is more uncannily supernatural than Stoker's original.
