Medical Assessment by your doctor will be required when you join CFT. When you reach the age of 35 a three yearly assessment until the age of 55. After 55 the assessments will be carried out annually. Chest X-rays, ECGs and other investigations will be at the discretion of the examining doctor. The main focus of these assessments will be on the important general factors such as heart , lung or neurological diseases or medicines that may create risk.

This year CFT divers will be asked to complete a fitness test and confidential medical assessment each year together with a medical assessment by your own GP which will be less frequent than in the past.

****** Did You Know

*Sharks attack some 50-75 people each year with perhaps 8-12 fatalities, 350 or so shark species about 80% grow to less than 1.6 M Only 32 species have been documented in attacks on humans and another 36 species are considered potentially dangerous. At a size of 1.8M three species have been identified repeatedly in attacks Great White, Tiger & Bull sharks.

*An estimated 80% of all life on earth is found under the ocean and the ocean contains 99% of the living space in the planet. Less than 10% of that space has been explored by humans. 85% of the area and 90% of the volume constitute the dark ,cold environment we call the deep. The average depth of the ocean is 3,795M The average height of the land is 840M. The oceans cover 71% of the earths surface and contain 97% of the earths water. Less than 1% is fresh water and 2-3% is contained in glaciers and ice caps, 90% of volcanic activity occurs in the oceans.

*The highest tides in the world are at the Bay of Fundy which separates New Brunswick from Nova Scotia. At some times of the year the difference between high and low tide is 16.3M taller than a three story building.

Pressure at the deepest point in the ocean is more than 11,318 tons / sq M, or the equivalent of one person trying to support 50 jumbo jets.

ICE Number

In Case of Emergency Number. This number is used by the Emergency Services in Ireland and other countries. It is very important to enter in your Mobile Phone under ICE your next of kin's phone number or the person you would like the Emergency service to contact in the case of an emergency. They would normally look

under ICE on your phone.
