



The History Of Saint Patrick



Ireland celebrates St Patrick's on March 17th every year. St Patrick is not only patron saint of Ireland, but of Australia, Nigeria and Montserrat. By all historic accounts Patrick was captured by an Irish raiding party somewhere along the west coast of Scotland or Wales. Raiding parties with warriors known as the Celts would raid along the coast looking for young people who would become slave's animals, clothes and weapons. They were able to run inland for about three miles non-stop and leave a handful of men to guard their boats. On one such raid Patrick was captured and taken to Ireland to work as a slave minding sheep to keep them safe from wolves, foxes and sometimes bears. He did this on the slopes of the Slemish Mountains in Co. Antrim. We know that Patrick's father was a deacon and prayed for his son's safe return. Although Patrick was only sixteen years old when taken into captivity he spent six years as a slave on his own and prayed to God for his release from slavery. He even had a dream of an angel telling him to escape south to a waiting boat in Dublin. This he did by leaving the flock and going south to Dublin. He arrived home to the delight of his parents and was reunited with his family and friends. He later began to realize he had a vocation to the priesthood or some ministry of prayer in the church. At this time there was already a Christian settlement in Ireland under Pallidus Archbishop of Armagh. Ireland was not ecclesiastically independent at that time being under the ecclesiastical jurisdiction of Arles in France. Patrick often thought about the Irish and prayed that they would come under their faith. During his time as a slave he developed a profound faith with God and developed a great ability to pray. He later confessed he heard the Irish in his dreams "come back to us". Once Patrick was ordained a priest and he learned Latin and French, he asked to be sent to Ireland as a missionary. Patrick had great missionary zeal and became the second arch bishop of Armagh and Primate of all Ireland. He set two goals up, first to convert the Irish and second to break with Arles. He came to Ireland and preached the love of God to the masses and converted the pagan Irish to Christianity and built monasteries and places of learning throughout Ireland. In turn many Irishmen became priests and bishops and in turn they went to Western Europe during the dark ages and inspired hope and civilisation. The Irish Catholic church owes it's foundation to Saint Patrick to this day.

Chocolate Orange Cake

Ingredients

- 200g/7oz Odlums Cream Plain Flour
- 1 rounded teaspoon Odlums Baking Powder
- 4 Large Eggs
- 150g/5oz Shamrock Golden Caster Sugar
- 50g/2oz Cocoa Powder
- 100ml Sunflower Oil or Light Olive Oil
- Rind of 2 Oranges, grated
- Juice of 1 Orange
- Few Drops Goodall's Orange Essence



To Decorate

- 175g/6oz Chocolate
- 170ml Cream
- Orange Rind

Method

1. Preheat oven to 180°C/350°F/Gas 4. Line a 20cm/8" deep cake tin with baking parchment.
2. Place eggs and sugar in a bowl over a pan of simmering water. Using electric mixer, whisk until thick and creamy and doubled in size.
3. Sieve over the flour, baking powder and cocoa and gently fold in. When almost mixed in, add the oil, juice and rind. Gently fold in.
4. Transfer to prepared tin and bake for 25 minutes, or until cake is risen and spongy when lightly pressed in the centre.
5. Cool in tin for 10 mins before transferring to wire tray to cool fully.
6. For the icing, combine the chocolate and cream in a bowl over a pan of simmering water until chocolate is melted. Stir occasionally. Remove from the heat.
7. Spread icing over top and sides of cake. Decorate with orange rind swirl. Enjoy!
