Beside the Sea

I have a room full of collectables gathered from the tide line. Many an early morning I would walk the beach, finding all sorts of treasure, sea shells, egg cases from the sharks, bottles of all description, beautiful stones and pebbles, smooth after years of washing, back and forth in the tide. We even had three whales stranded on the beach they were forty foot Sperm Whales. They were too big to help into deeper water, so they died, and were taken away on low loader transport lorries. We often see seals in the shallows and sea birds oiled up unable to fly. It's a busy place for people interested in preserving nature. We have the nature land gardens and pools near by they nurse baby seals and sea birds back to health and then release them back into the wild. We make our own ice cream so we get many visitors to the house on their way to the beach. We have a boat to catch cockles and mussels. They are cooked and sold. We put out night lines before the high tide to catch codling and other fish that stray inshore. Plaice and lemonsole are caught in the nearby estuary. The wonderful seaweed Samphire grows in abundance along the marsh. We harvest that in August and September. The cod comes close in shore during the winter time. The beach casters will stand all night in the hopes of catching nice fresh fish. Such a place is idyllic, but has certain dangers. You have to know the tide times and the weather so you don't get trapped on what started out as an adventure and a wonderful experience turning into something catastrophic. The RNLI do a marvellous job patrolling and recovering those who get into trouble. Many lives have been saved along the beach. We stripped the workshop one bad winter and built a twenty foot boat for the spring. The plans came from Saudi Arabia. It was designed to be unsinkable. We built a trawl net to go with it. I towed it out to the sea with the farm tractor. We had a lot of fun out on the sea fishing and cruising. I do miss the house beside the sea and all that went with it.

Easter Cupcakes with Nests

Ingredients

- 300g/10oz Odlums Self Raising Flour
- 225g/8oz Butter (room temperature)
- 225g/8oz Shamrock Golden Caster Sugar
- 2 Eggs (room temperature)
- 1 teaspoon Odlums Baking Powder
- Few drops Goodall's Vanilla Essence
- 4-5 tablespoons Milk Buttercream Icing
- 125g/4oz Butter (room temperature)
- 225g/8oz Icing Sugar, sieved
- Few Drops Goodall's Vanilla Essence
- Few Drops Goodall's Colouring (optional)

Method

- **Chocolate Nests**
 - 125g/40z Chocolate, melted
 - Shredded Wheat
 - Mini Eggs
 - Mini Eggs



- 1. Preheat oven to 180°C/350°F/Gas 4. Line bun tin with baking cases.
- 2. Beat the butter and sugar together until light and fluffy. Gradually beat in the eggs, milk and the vanilla essence. If mixture starts to curdle, add a little of the flour.
- 3. Gently add remaining flour and sieve in the baking powder, mix to combine. Place spoonfuls of the mixture into the baking cases and bake for 15-20 minutes until firm to the touch.
- 4. Remove from the oven and leave on a wire tray to cool.
- 5. Make buttercream by beating the butter, icing sugar and vanilla essence together until smooth and creamy.
- 6. If desired, divide the icing into separate bowls for each colour you want to use, gradually add colouring and mix well until required colour is achieved.
- 7. Pipe or swirl icing onto each cupcake.
- 8. Make chocolate nests by adding broken shredded wheat into the melted chocolate, shape into a nest, leaving a hollow centre. Allow to cool. When cold put some mini eggs into the nest.
- 9. Top cupcakes with chocolate nests and mini eggs. Happy Easter!
