Catering Unit

Winter Warmers

Leek & potato Soup

1lb thick white leeks

3/4 of 1 lb potatoes

1/2 oz fat

1 pint of stock

½ pint milk

Salt & pepper to taste

1/8 pint cream optional

Dumplings

4oz self raising flour

2 oz shredded suet

Salt & pepper

Water to mix

Classic Beef Stew

2oz lard or 3 tblsps of vegetable oil

2 lb of stewing steak

4 medium onions

12 oz of carrots

2 level tblsps flour

1 pint of beef stock

1 level tblsp of tomato puree

Salt & pepper

2 bay leaves

Method

Wash& trim chop the leeks. Peel & chop the potatoes. Melt the fat & cook the vegetables over a gentle heat. Boil the stock, add to the vegetables & cook. When soft blend & season to taste. Just before serving add cream & stir in.

Method

Mix the dry ingredients with sufficient cold water to make an elastic dough. Divide into portions & roll into small balls. Add to the gravy & simmer for 20 minutes.

Method

Melt the lard. Trim the meat into cubes. Fry each batch until browned. Remove and add chopped vegetables and brown. Remove. Sprinkle the flour into the pan & stir well until blended. Add the stock, tomato puree &seasoning until the roux begins to turn light brown. Bring slowly to the boil then add the meat & vegetables & bay leaves.

Cover the casserole tightly & cook in the oven at 170 degrees centigrade for about 2 ½ hours. Uncover & stir during cooking. Add dumplings until cooked. Remove bay leaves before serving.
