Catering

Traditional Christmas Pudding

Ingredients

100g plain or self raising flour

2 tsps ground cinnamon

2 tsps mixed spice

350g fresh white breadcrumb

50g of ground almonds

225g brown sugar

1 carrot grated

1 apple grated

Grated rind & juice of 1 orange

1 lemon

225g each sultanas seedless raisins & currants

100g chopped glazed cherries


175g chopped mixed peel

225g butter

300ml of Guinness

4 tbsp sherry

5 eggs



Method

Put the prepared fruit & all dry ingredients into a large bowl & mix well. Add the grated rind of the orange & lemon, carrot & apple. Mix again. Beat the eggs add them gradually. Add the butter, stout & sherry. Mix together thoroughly. Add any charms. Put into greased basins cover with grease proof paper then tie a cloth over. Steam or boil for 7 hours. When cooked uncover & let steam out. Recover lightly with grease proof paper.

Before serving steam or reboil for 2 hours.

Serve with brandy butter.

Santa Claus

Also known as Saint Nicholas, the bishop of Myra, was born in 260 AD, in Patara, in what is now Turkey. He is a legendary figure in Western, Christian Culture, who is said to bring gifts to the homes of well-behaved children. He was also known as Nicholas the wonder worker. He is the Patron Saint of Sailors, merchants, archers, repentant thieves, children, brewers, pawn brokers, and students in various cities, and countries around Europe. His reputation evolved among the faithful as was common for early Christian saints. He is closely associated with Russia, Greece, Holland, Austria, Belgium, Aberdeen, and New York. Many churches are dedicated to him. Saint Nicholas is the third most popular subject of icons in the church, with Jesus Christ, and the Blessed Virgin Mary, having more representations. His feast day is observed on December the sixth, with great celebrations, services, and gift giving. The beloved saint died in 343 AD. Tradition in these parts tell that the earthly remains of Saint Nicholas were secretly removed from Bari, by crusader knights, who brought them back to Newtown, Jerpoint Kilkenny, for safe keeping, they buried those remains with all due reverence in the church that to this day, bears the Saints name.


