Cotton white clouds roll by above her fair head

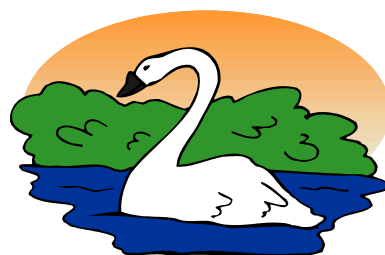
She gathers up the folds of her sky blue dress

Catering Unit

INGREDIENTS

2teaspoons pesto sauce

1whole-grain pita

1 1/2cups arugula

1/4cup tomatoes

1tablespoon pine nuts

1/4cup white beans

1teaspoon olive oil

1tablespoon lemon juice

DIRECTIONS

1. Spread 2 teaspoons pesto on a whole-grain pita; broil until golden.
2. Toss 1 1/2 cups arugula, 1/4 cup chopped tomato, 1 tablespoon pine nuts, 1/4 cup canned white beans (rinsed and drained) and 1 teaspoon olive oil with fresh lemon juice, salt and pepper to taste.
3. Serve on pita.

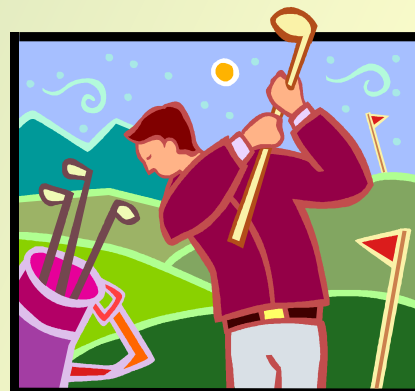
Remember the five simple rules to be happy:

A day s bowling at K-Bowl

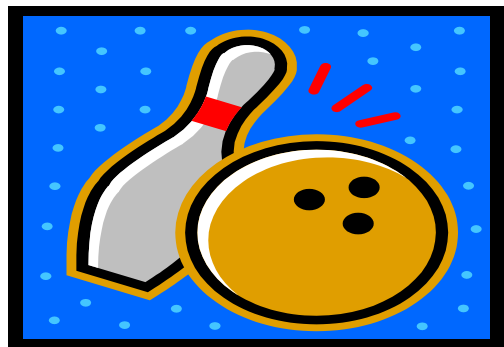

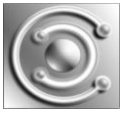
