Rocky Road Bars



Ingredients:

2 x Packets of Jacobs Lincoln Cream Biscuits Crushed
225g / 8oz Butter
225g / 8oz Caster Sugar
2 Eggs (beaten)
3 x Galaxy Chocolate Bars
4 tablespoons drinking chocolate
4 Large Packets of Maltesers
1 Packet of Rolo
1 Packet of Munchies
1 large Packet of Small Marshmallows.

Method:

1. Melt the butter and sugar in a saucepan over low heat.
2. Remove from the heat and allow to cool slightly.
3. Add the eggs and stir well.
4. Add all the remaining ingredients and mix well.
5. Transfer to a swiss roll tin 33cms x 23cms.
6. Press down well with the back of the spoon.
7. Allow to get cold and cut into bars.
